

Our Strengths

At KS2, until 2019, the improving trend in writing, over the last four years, has culminated in the percentage of our children meeting the expected standard being higher than the national average. Despite the Pandemic (and extremely low starting points) our Y6 children achieved in line with their peers, nationally, in 2022.

At KS2, between 2016 and 2019, we have seen an improving trend in reading, grammar and spelling attainment, with results above the national average.

Between 2016 and 2019, we have seen an improving trend in the number of our EY children achieving a Good Level of Development.

To ensure that each and every one of our children develop, rapidly, as early readers and they achieve sound phonological awareness/ability.

To ensure that outcomes in DT are always high quality and our DT Curriculum is progressive from N2 to Y6.






Religious Education at Britannia Bridge Subject Leader: Mr Anthony Concannon
